

Global Outreach Partner Jeremy Holloman

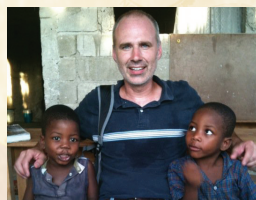
On January 12, 2010 a magnitude 7.0 earthquake devastated the already embattled Haiti. The Haitian government reported that an estimated 230,000 people died, 300,000 had been injured and 1,000,000 made homeless. Haiti Replacement Homes is working to help provide homes for these families.

Dunwoody Baptist Church member Jeremy Holloman is the program director for the recently created project of Conscience International, Haiti Replacement Homes (HRH). As a general contractor, Jeremy brings twenty years of experience in the construction industry to the HRH staff. Jeremy also has extensive experience working in disaster areas in Central America.

HRH builds seismically safe, environmentally friendly homes for families left homeless by the earthquake that hit in January 2010. By using local labor HRH injects cash into the local economy and their crew members are able to buy food and clothing for their families and send their children to school. HRH also purchases building supplies in Haiti, supporting local businesses and keeping people employed.

Using a cutting edge home design developed by Conscience International, HRH is able to recycle the rubble from destroyed buildings to build the walls of the homes—walls that are earthquake resistant. HRH builds the homes, where possible, on the site of the family's old home. This keeps the family in familiar surroundings and does not separate them from their support networks.
